



A Negro Woman Speaks for Peace

One of the delegates to the Inter-American Peace Congress in Uruguay tells how they met under extreme difficulties put in their way due to pressure from the A first-hand report on what South American things and doing for world peace.

By LORRAINE HANSBERRY

(The following excerpts are from a speech delivered by Miss Hansberry, member of the American delegation to the In-American delegation to the In-ser-American Peace Congress, at a "Report Back Rally" held on April 17 in New York. The Congress, originally scheduled to be held in Buenos Aires, and banned by the Chilean govern-ment under pressure from the U. S. Sinte Department, was finally held in Montevideo un-der great difficulties and the direct attack of the government at Urusuas.

THERE IS SO MUCH I would like to tell, to describe peace fighters of our nation-but ecause there isn't time I shall speak rather of the things I arned-we learned in Monte-

fraternity, something about courage, something about orgreat deal about determination. Frest deal about determination. For this is why the Congress was held-because of the determination of the representative of the people. This is the great lesson for peoples everywhere, that out of the determination of these 200 or more people who managed to get to the Congress in spite of everything the enemies of peace could hurl at them—passport denisls, wisa denisls, police intimidation news at passport denisis, visa demias, police intimidation, press at-tacks—the Congress for peace was held. Because the deter-mined peoples of the Americas have said: there must be peace. HONORED BY PEACE FIGHTERS

The morning after I arrived in Montevideo I went to the meeting of the women. I walked in and ownering of the women. I walked in and sourceoe gave me a seat. Then she embraced me and made a speech, which pledged she andidarity of the sounce of Brazil, which has a good five million more Negroes than we have in the United States! And I was very moved of all like women in that moon, the real heroises of the peace movement in America women who had become in fail, who like it moves the women in the women of the peace movement in America women who had become in fail, who like it moves the women in the lone representative of Negro womanhood from the United States, indeed, representative of all North American women, to hour-we, who is our own hemisphere, I am ashamed to say, have done the least.

Befare I could thank them

Before I could thank them for this, a young Urugusyan woman stood before me with a little Urugusyan doll in her hand and with tears in her eyes she told me that the people of Uruguay are deeply unhappy and angry because for the first time there is racial discrimina-tion in their country. You should know that one of the uglinesses of the U. S. interests ogmosses of the U. S. intrestring in Uruguay is the presence of a sound truck which has gone through the streets of Monte-trideo preaching anti-Semitism and race hatred. And there are now hotels in Montevideo where a Negro guest must not stay.

I will never forget the street meeting in the great plaza when the representatives of the na-tions took their places on a huge platform and each rose to bring

voice choked up a little as I stood to present the U. S. delegation's gift to the Uruguayan host peace committee, and said;
"People of Uruguay, in my
hand I hold a message from a man whose same in my counby is synonymous with th peace"-and from everywhere it rang out. "Viva Robeson! Viva

I told then what the little piece of tape recording said, that peace would be won through the struggles of people like themselves, that peace would conquer war, and that, yes, this message was from our beloved Faul Robeson and they cheered again. The Magazine Section of the "Worker" on June 22, 1952, carried portions of a speech made by the subject at a "Report Back Rally" held in New York on April 17, 1952. It is indicated that HANSEERRY was a member of the Inter-American Peace Congress held in Montivideo. In this speech, HANSEERRY praised the Congress who had honored her by electing her as one of the three women on the presidium. In this speech, she held the name of PAUL ROHESON to be synonymous with peace.

The "Worker" is the Sunday edition of the "Daily Worker," an East Coast Communist daily newspaper.

Residence

During a pretext telephone call by an agent of the FBI on July 23, 1956, to a person who identified herself as the subject, it was determined that NEMIRGFF resides at 337 Bleecker Street, New York City.

Employment

During a pretext phone call to People's Artists, Incorporated, 124 West 21st Street, New York City, on July 27, 1956, by an agent of the FBI, it was determined that the subject is employed there for approximately four hours a day Monday through Friday.

January, February, April, May, June September, 1954, December of 1955, reflected that LORRAINE HANSBERRY was the Associate Editor of that paper. By means of a phone call to the JSSS on September 20, 1954, by an agent of the FBI, 13 was determined that NEMIROFF was then employed by that school.

Records of the Manhattan Board of Elections, as reviewed by SA on June 6, 1956, reflected that in 1953, the subject indicated she was employed by Rachel Productions, 756 7th Avenue, New York City.
