EATON and Dr. LINUS PAULING were co-chairmen of a committee to welcome Professor KAORU YASUI, and that they had issued invitations to a group of prominent Americans in all walks of life to honor YASUI, who is to speak in Honolulu and eight mainland cities on a ten-day peace tour of the US, from 11/16 - 26/63. announcement of the "National Guardian's" Fifteenth Anniversary Dinner, as previously set forth, listed approximately 114 individuals who are to welcome YASUI. The 11/7/63 issue of the "National Guardian", p. 6. contained an article captioned "Welcoming Committee sponsors for YASUI," which set forth the names of about two hundred individuals (to date), with names only and no identifying data, as sponsors of the YASUI Welcoming Committee. The NYO will report the US tour of Professor YASUI, as sponsored by the "National Guardian", and the activity of Dr. LIMUS PAULING and Mrs. CYRUS EATON in chairing the Welcoming Committee for Professor YASUI, in the next regular "National Guardian" report, which is due 2/5/64. No further action is being taken by the NYO with respect to each individual sponsor, unless advised to the contrary by the Bureau. A letterhead memorandum concerning the "National Guardian's" Fifteenth Anniversary Dinner, which YASUI is to attend, will be submitted.







(YASUI is dean of the Law School at Hosei University in Tokyo and an expert in international law). DAGMAR WILSON of Women Strike for Peace and FREDA KIRCHWEY, United Nations observer for the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, are on the committee, as are ILWU President HARRY BPIDGES and ERNEST DE MAIO of United Electrical Workers in Chicago. 



The following are the details of the DMC meeting held 2/23/64 at Carnegie Hall, NYC, obtained during the course of this affair which was monitored by SAS and

OSSIE DAVIS chaired the meeting.

Bishop STEPHEN GILL SPOTTSWOOD, African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church gave the invocation.

Tributes to DU BOIS were given by ARNA BONTEMPS of Fisk University, Nashville, Tenn., ARTHUR B. SPINGARN, President, NAACP and ESLANDA GOODE ROBESON.

BONTEMPS gave some history of DU BOIS emphasizing the leadership of DU BOIS in the mon-violent fight for equality for the Negro people. BONTEMPS tribute was based on a review of DU BOIS' writings.

SPINGARN told of his 60 year personal friendship with DU BOIS even though they were, for the last years of DU BOIS life, worlds apart ideologically. He called DU BOIS one of the great figures of the first half of the 20th century. He told how DU BOIS wanted the same equal rights for the Negro many, many years ago which are being advocated today, and how DU BOIS foresaw the free African states which exist today.

ROBESON thanked the crowd "for the wonderful welcome home" which she and PAUL (ROBESON) had received. She stated that DU BOIS was a great statesman, an inspirational leader, who had a keen political insight. She stated that DU BOIS recognized the power of socialism adding that the world will eventually have to come to somm form of socialism.

The main address was given by Dr. JOHN HOPE FRANKLIN of Brooklyn College who expressed some bitterness of how the news media had played down, or practically ignored the death of DU BOIS. He stated that since the birth of the United States, the people of the nation have refused to regard the Negro as "just another human being", rather they regard the Negro as a 2nd class citizen, but certainly this was not the fault of DU BOIS. He stated that as great a scholar as was DU BOIS, he was rejected by his white peers because of the color of his skin. He stated that DU BOIS, as a Negro scholar, set about to educate the whites to accept people for what they are, not for the color of their skin, adding that his courage and zeal have long given inspiration to the Negro people. FRANKLIN concluded stating that the March on Washington in August, 1963 began with the drive by DU BOIS 60 years ago for first class citizenship for the Negro.

Following an intermission, tributes to DU BOIS were read by OSSIE DAVIS from the following:

> LANGSTON HUGHES Dr. RALPH J. BUNCHE JAMES FARMER of CORE DAISY BATES African American Heritage

ROCKWELL KENT WILLIAM L. PATTERSON Rev. HARRY F. WARD WHITNEY M. YOUNG of the Urban League Association through ISHMAEL FLORY from Chicago.

DAVIS then announced that on Channel 13 at 9:30 that evening there had appeared a tribute to DU BOIS, which would be repeated on that channel at 7:30 PM, 2/27/64.

LORRAINE HANSBERRY was introduced to read a message of thanks from SHIRLEY GRAHAM DU BOIS. She prefaced this by remarking on her own that the legacy of the Negro is synonymous with the name of DU BCIS.

DAVIS then introduced a cousin of DU BOIS, ALICE BURGHARDT.

A "dramatic presentation of the life and writings of Dr. DU BOIS" was given entitled "In These My Words", written by SYLVESTER LEAKS, with ROSCOE LEE BROWN, JOHN RANDOLPH, RUBY DEE, OSSIE DAVIS, Participating. A mild ovation was given when it was mentioned by DAVIS how DU BOIS had joined the CP at the age of 90. DAVIS stated that while many do not agree with his (DU BOIS) ideas, that people "should take a wait and see attitude." He said "not to condemn DU BOIS just because you don't agree with his conclusions drawn upon his many, many years of thinking."

The benediction was given by Rev. WILLIAM HOWARD MELISH.

The program ended at approximately 11:30 PM. There were no demonstrations or incidents.

Forum: "The Black Revolution and the White Backlash", Town Hall, New York City, June 15, 1964, Sponsored by the Association of Artists for Freedom Racial Matters

The May 23, 1964 issue of the "National Guardian", page 12, contained an advertisement which announced that a Forum entitled "The Black Revolution and the White Backlash" would be held at Town Hall, 123 West 43rd Street, New York, New York, on Monday evening, June 15, 1964, at 8:00 PM. The advertisement indicated that David Susskind would be the moderator of the Forum and that participants would include Ossie Davis, Ruby Dee, Leroi Jones, Paule Marshall, James Wechsler, Lorraine Hansberry, Charles Silberman, John Oliver Killens and others. The announcement stated that the Forum was sponsored by the Association of Artists for Freedom (AAF), 15 East 40th Street, New York, New York, whose founding members included John Oliver Killens, chairman, and members:

Ossie Davis, Ruby Dee, James Baldwin, and Louis Lomax; and that Clarence B. Jones was Counsel to the organization.

The advertisement stated that tickets for the Forum were priced from \$4.00 to \$2.00 each.

A characterization of the "National Guardian" is contained in the Appendix pages attached hereto.
