Lorraine Hansberry's Estate Is Put at 115G

Playwright Lorraine Hansberry, who died of cancer Jan. 12, left an estate valued at \$115,000.

Under the terms of her will, probated in White Plains Surrogate Court this week, Miss Hansberry put most of her property, including her plays, into a trust fund to be administered by her husband, producer Robert Nemiroff.

The will provides annual payments of \$8,500 to the 34-year-old Negro writer's mother, Mrs.

Carl Hansberry Sr., and a \$1,000 bequest to a Dorothy Sueles of New York City, not otherwise identified.

Miss Hansberry, the first Negro playwright to win the Critic's Circle Award, also stipulated that surplus money in the trust fund should go to civil rights groups, writers' organizations and charities, in that order.

Lorraine Hansberry Left Funds to Rights Cause

Special to The New York Times

WHITE PLAINS, Jan. 28—

Miss Lorraine Hansberry, the playwright, who died in New York on Jan. 12, left part of her \$115,000 estate to the civil rights cause.

Miss Hansberry's will, filed in Westchester County Surrogate's Court here today, gave to her husband, Robert B. Nemiroff of 337 Bleecker Street, New York, personal items and half the stock of Vivian Pro-

ductions. Burton C. D'Lugoff of 55 East 10th Street, New York, received the other half of the stock.

Interests in trust funds were left to Mrs. Nannie Hansberry, the author's mother; Mrs. Mamie H. Tubbs, a sister, and Miss Nantille H. Tubbs, a niece, all of Los Angeles, and Miss Dorothy Secules, a friend, of 112 Waverly Place, New York.

Surplus income from trusts and, ultimately, the principal were left to civil rights organizations selected by trustees and to various writers.

"Dr. Henry A. Callis is the founder of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity and a physician residing in Washington, D.C.

"Dr. Irene Diggs was Secretary to Dr. Du Bois when he was Director of Special Research for the NAACP. She is now a member of the faculty at Morgan State Teacher's College, Baltimore.

"Andrew Paschal who lives in Chicago has been a collector of the works of Du Bois since childhood. He is also a champion salesman for FREEDOMWAYS, selling at least 100 copies per issue.

"James E. Jackson, Editor of The Worker, first met Dr. Du Bois when a boy in Richmond, Va. The association continued during the years of the Southern Negro Youth Congress (1937-47) until Du Bois' move to Ghana.

"Playwright William Branch was present at the funeral services of Dr. Du Bois in Ghana which he reported in a moving story in the N.Y. Amsterdam News.

"Actress Ruby Dee was last seen on Broadway in 'Purlie Victorious' written by her husband, Ossie Davis. She is also well-known to movie and television audiences.

"Dr. John Hope Franklin, former Chairman of the History Department of Brooklyn College now teaches at the University of Chicago."

It is reflected that the paid circulation to term subscribers by mail, carrier delivery, or by any other means, averaged 4,000 copies of each issue during the preceeding twelve months. The paid circulation of the single issue nearest to the filing date was 4,500.

The average number of copies sold through agents, news dealers, or otherwise during the preceeding twelve months was 3,200 and of the issue nearest to the filing date, 2,400.

The free distribution (including samples) averaged 250 copies of each issue during the preceeding twelve months and 150 copies of the single issue nearest to the filing date.

The total average number of copies of each issue distributed during the prior twelve months was 7,450, and of the single issue nearest the filing date 7,100 copies.
