"Dr. Eugene C. Holmes is Chairman of the Department of Philosophy, Howard University, Washington, D.C."

"Truman Nelson is a lecturer and writer whose best known work is 'The Sin of the Prophet' on the life of John Brown. He is now at work on a novel with W. E. B. DU BOIS as the central character."

"Dr. Charles H. Wesley is National President, Association for Study of Negro Life and History and President, Central State College, Ohio. He is the author of a number of outstanding historical studies."

"Dr. Hansberry, former professor of History at Howard University, is presently Professor of African History -- Hansberry School of African History, University of Eastern Nigeria."

"Dr. Herbert Aptheker is the Literary Executor of the Du Bois papers. Among his many books is !The Documentary History of the Negro People in the United States!."

"Dr. Mozell Hill followed W. E. B. Du Bois as Editor of Phylon. He is now on the faculty of New York University."

"Mrs. Sinnette is District Librarian for the New York Board of Education in the Central and East Harlem area. She is the mother of two growing children." "Sterling Stuckey is President of the Amistad Society, A Committee on Negro Culture and History, and a teacher of history in the public schools of Chicago."

"J. H. O'Dell was formerly staff consultant to the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. His article, 'Foundations of Racism in American Life,' appeared in the previous issue of FREEDOMWAYS."

"Richard B. Moore is owner of the Frederick Douglass book store in Harlem. He also lectures widely on many aspects of African and Afroamerican history."

"Carlton B. Goodlett, publisher of the Sun-Reporter, San Francisco, and a practicing physician is associated with the World Peace Council."

"Carl Bloice, west coast journalist, is Publications Director for the W. E. B. Du Bois Clubs."

"Bernard Fonlon is the Editor of Abbia, the Cameroon Cultural Review, published in the Federal Republic of Cameroon."

"Ernest Kaiser frequently reviews books for FREEDOMWAYS. He is on the staff of the Schomburg Collection, N.Y. Public Library."

The following information is set forth on pages 214 and 215 of this issue under the caption "Among Our Contributors":

"Dr. Horace Mann Bond is the dean of the School of Education, Atlanta University and a nationally known lecturer and writer in the field of Education.

"C. L. R. James, born in Trinidad, now lives in London. He is the author of 'Black Jacobins' and 'A History of Negro Revolt.' His article, 'Parties, Politics and Economics of the Caribbean' appeared in the Caribbean issue of FREEDOMWAYS (Vol. 4, No.3).

'Dr. Henry A. Callis is the founder of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity and a physician residing in Washington, D.C.

"Dr. Irene Diggs was Secretary to Dr. Du Bois when he was Director of Special Research for the NAACP. She is now a member of the faculty at Morgan State Teacher's College, Baltimore.

"Andrew Paschal who lives in Chicago has been a collector of the works of Du Bois since childhood. He is also a champion salesman for FREEDOMWAYS, selling at least 100 copies per issue.

"Dr. Conor Cruise O'Brien is the former United Nations Representative in Katanga and is now the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ghana.

"George B. Murphy, Jr. of the Washington Afro-American staff, has been associated with civil rights and civil liberties for many years.

"Dr. Lee Lorch, now teaching at the Mathematics Institute, Aarhus University, Denmark, was formerly on the faculty of a number of colleges in the U.S. He was actively involved with civil rights and integration struggles in Nashville and at Central High School, Little Rock, Arkansas.

"Lorraine Hansberry is the author of the plays, 'Raisin in the Sun' and 'The Sign in Sidney Brustein's Window'. Her recent death at the age of 34 was an incalculable loss to the freedom movement in America.

"James E. Jackson, Editor of The Worker, first met Dr. Du Bois when a boy in Richmond, Va. The association continued during the years of the Southern Negro Youth Congress (1937-47) until Du Bois' move to Ghana.

"Playwright William Branch was present at the funeral services of Dr. Du Bois in Ghana which he reported in a moving story in the N.Y. Amsterdam News.

"Actress Ruby Dee was last seen on Broadway in 'Purlie Victorious' written by her husband, Ossie Davis. She is also well-known to movie and television audiences.

"Dr. John Hope Franklin, former Chairman of the History Department of Brooklyn College now teaches at the University of Chicago."

This issue also contains the "Statement of Ownership, Management and Circulation" of the magazine which was filed on 10/1/64 pursuant to the Act of October 23, 1962; Section 4369, Title 39, United States Code. This statement notes that the owner of the publication is Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, 799 Broadway, NY, NY, and that the stockholders are CYRIL PHILIP, DOROTHY BURNHAM, and Dr. CALVIN H. SINNETTE all of whom are listed at the address of Room 544, 799 Broadway, NY, NY.

This statement which was prepared by ESTHER JACKSON, Managing Editor, reflects that the total average number of copies printed of each issue during the preceding twelve months was 8,000 copies and that there were 10,000 copies printed of the issue nearest the filing date.

It is reflected that the paid circulation to term subscribers by mail, carrier delivery, or by any other means, averaged 4,000 copies of each issue during the preceding twelve months. The paid circulation of the single issue nearest to the filing date was 4,500.

The average number of copies sold through agents, news dealers, or otherwise during the preceding twelve months was 3,200 and of the issue nearest to the filing date, 2,400.

The free distribution (including samples) averaged 250 copies of each issue during the preceeding twelve months and 150 copies of the single issue nearest to the filing date.

The total average number of copies of each issue distributed during the prior twelve months was 7,450, and of the single issue nearest the filing date 7,100 copies.

Copies of the contributions of individuals to this issue are being forwarded as enclosures with this letter to the interested offices.

A copy of the Winter 1965 issue of "Freedomways" is maintained in the Library of the NYO.
